In October of each year, the Division on Addictions hosts a course in Addiction Medicine. The primary focus of the 2009 course is "New Evidencebased Strategies for the Prescriber." This course imparts information on methods of diagnosis and protocols for intervention and management of patients with substance abuse and dependence. Our expert faculty provides a unique forum for dialogue and participant interaction.

Goals:

- To inform participants about new evidence-based strategies for the prescriber who medically manages patients with addiction
- To develop management methods for helping substance abusers and/or addicted patients in a variety of settings
- To inform participants of the best addiction treatment practices in both primary care and specialty settings
- To foster increased dialogue between primary care and addiction professionals, and illustrate how these specialties can work together for the benefit of individuals with addictions

Objectives: As a result of this course, participants will increase their understanding of:

- The role of prescription drugs for managing addictions and drug diversion
- How to medically manage addictions: Methadone maintenance, detoxification strategies, lab testing, and nicotine replacement therapy Treating patients with Suboxone
- How to manage dually-diagnosed patients
- How to implement evidence-based strategies when prescribing
